



ST. PETE BEACH RECLAIMED WATER VOLUNTARY RESTRICTIONS – IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

The City of St. Pete Beach is committed to water conservation and education in the community during the current dry season. Please follow the voluntary water restrictions below **if you live in the City of St. Pete Beach and use RECLAIMED WATER:**

- 1. DO NOT WATER BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 10 A.M. - 4 P.M. , 7 DAYS A WEEK.**
- 2. DO NOT WATER MORE THAN TWICE A WEEK IF POSSIBLE.**
- 3. IF YOU HAVE NEW SOD OR PLANTS, PLEASE CONTACT YOUR LANDSCAPE SPECIALIST FOR PROFESSIONAL GUIDELINES. DO NOT WATER BETWEEN 10 A.M. – 4 P.M., 7 DAYS A WEEK. WATER ONLY AS NECESSARY DURING THE EVENING.**
- 4. THE CITY DOES NOT ISSUE VIOLATIONS ON A VOLUNTARY RESTRICTION WATER SCHEDULE. PLEASE CONSERVE AND FOLLOW THE SUGGESTED GUIDELINES ABOVE.**

NON RECLAIMED WATER USERS: If you do not have reclaimed water and live in St. Pete Beach and use potable (tap) water outside, **YOU MUST CALL PINELLAS COUNTY AT 464.4000 FOR SPECIFIC WATER RESTRICTIONS.** Pinellas County owns the potable water system and has a new separate, enforceable restrictions ordinance. Please call Pinellas County if you use potable water for irrigation.

Please note: The City of St. Pete Beach owns and operates its reclaimed water system and establishes its own voluntary watering restrictions. Our reclaimed water users do not fall under the odd/even watering schedule issued by Pinellas County. We ask St. Pete Beach residents to voluntarily restrict their reclaimed watering (see #1 through #4 above). We strive to be good stewards of water conservation and believe cooperation and education will help the environment until the drought season subsides. We appreciate your continued support.
