This week Firefighters from St. Pete Beach, Treasure Island, Gulfport, and South Pasadena practiced their skills as they relate to pediatric drowning. The Firefighters used the St. Pete Beach public pool and conducted real time scenarios. A child sized practice mannequin was placed on the bottom of the pool, and firefighters had to remove the child from the pool, perform a assessment of the patient, and then take the necessary life saving measures. According to Pinellashealth.com Florida leads the nation in young children who drown, and 75% of all child drowning occur in private swimming pools.
