

RESOLUTION NO. 2008-06

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH, PINELLAS COUNTY, FLORIDA PROVIDING FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE VOTE CAST IN A GENERAL ELECTION FOR MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS FOR DISTRICT 1 AND DISTRICT 3 AND THE REFERENDUM QUESTION OF WHETHER THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT ON ORDINANCE 2007-33 SHOULD BE ADOPTED.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of St. Pete Beach, Pinellas County, Florida in a regular meeting duly assembled on Tuesday, March 18, 2008, resolves as follows:

Whereas, there was a General Election held on March 11, 2008 in St. Pete Beach for determination of Mayor, Commissioner for District 1, Commissioner for District 3 and a referendum question as to whether the Comprehensive Plan Amendment provided for in Ordinance 2007-33 should be adopted; and

Whereas, The City Commission previously authorized the County Canvassing Board to canvass and provide the results of the March 11, 2008 General Election.






