

RESOLUTION 2009-17

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH, FLORIDA,
OPPOSING THE PROPOSED CLOSING OF THE TWO POST OFFICES IN ST. PETE BEACH;
AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the two post offices on St. Pete Beach have been serving the residents, businesses and visitors since 1905; and

WHEREAS, the mail services of both Post Offices are very much relied on by businesses and residents for their shipping, receiving and purchasing of mailing items; and

WHEREAS, the post offices are an intrinsic part of living on St. Pete Beach and would cause great difficulty for scores of people many of whom are senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, the post offices being located in St. Pete Beach is a service the residents are accustomed to and closing them would create an undue burden by requiring citizens to drive many miles to the next closest post office; and

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of St. Pete Beach, that:


Section 1. The City Commission of the City of St. Pete Beach highly recommends that both Post Offices on St. Pete Beach remain open.

Section 2. The City Commission urges the residents of St. Pete Beach to contact Congressman Bill Young and the St. Petersburg Postmaster General to oppose the potential closing of the Post Offices.

Section 3. A copy of this resolution be transmitted to Congressman Bill Young and the St. Petersburg Postmaster General.


Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
