~HAZARD TO NAVIGATION—BOCA CIEGA BAY—SUBMERGED 38' POWER BOAT—

Please be advised of a submerged 38' power boat located about 100 yards off of Green Marker #1 near the channel entrance to Pasadena Yacht & Country Club in Boca Ciega Bay. The submerged vessel is lying to the east (towards Gulfport) in 8' of water and barely visible. This is a serious night time navigation hazard. The United States Coast Guard has been advised, but this could take several weeks to remove.

~MESSAGE FROM THE CITY OF ST. PETE BEACH~The City of St. Pete Beach has a vacancy on the City Commission for the seat of Mayor-Commissioner, effective June 30, 2016. As provided in the City Charter, the City Commission shall fill the vacancy until the next regular election.

At their July 7, 2016 Special Meeting, the Commission approved the process to fill the vacancy as follows:

Interested candidates must meet the following qualifications:

1. Shall be a full-time resident of the City of St. Pete Beach for a period of one (1) year prior to June 29, 2016; and
2. Shall be a qualified voter of Pinellas County; and
3. Shall be qualified under the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida to hold the office to which he or she desires to be nominated or elected.

Interested candidates must:

1. Submit letter of interest; and
2. Submit a resume (or Curriculum vitae); and
3. Specify the reason(s) you want to serve as Mayor and what specific skills/qualifications you possess that make you the better candidate.

The City Commission will interview candidates in the Commission Chambers prior to the regular City Commission meeting on Tuesday, July 26, 2016. The exact time will be determined. The Oath of Office will be given to the successful candidate that evening at the regular meeting beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- » Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- » The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- » Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- » Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- » Never leave your grill unattended.
- » Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- » There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- » If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- » Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- » There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- » When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.


PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

If the flame **goes out**, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least **5 minutes** before re-lighting it.

FACTS

- ! July is the peak month for grill fires.
- ! Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

Sources of Surface Water Pollution



When it rains, water that is not absorbed into the ground, intercepted by vegetation, or evaporated flows into surface waters such as rivers, canals and coastal waters. This flow is called runoff. As the runoff flows over the roads and land, it picks up pollutants.



The City of St. Pete Beach just completed the annual review of their Stormwater Program. We are proud to announce that the City is doing a great job to reduce pollutants in the stormwater that flows to Boca Ciega Bay!

- The City's Building Department has increased inspections of construction sites to make sure that erosion and sediment control systems are installed and working properly.
- Public Services and Building Department staff that are responsible for inspections are all FDEP certified for Erosion and Sediment control and for recognizing illicit discharges.
- The City continues to work with Pinellas County to make sure that commercial landscape companies are properly certified to apply fertilizer and pesticides.
- The City continues to pick up litter from the beaches every day and supported efforts to clean up the beaches on July 5 after the fireworks celebration.
- The City contracts with a company to provide monthly street sweeping to keep roadways clear of pollution causing materials.

- The City inspects and cleans stormwater pipe outfalls to make sure they are clear of debris so that stormwater flows easily from roadways.

The City tracks the amount of litter from roads and beaches that is collected and kept out of the Bay and the Gulf. This amount is reported to FDEP every year. If you walk on the beach and pick up litter, let City Public Services know when and how much litter you pick up (such as a 1-gallon bag of trash). The City will record the information for next year's annual report to FDEP.
