-DUKE ENERGY POTENTIAL CHANGE IN BILLING DATE FOR SOME DUKE ENERGY CUSTOMERS THIS MESSAGE IS BEING SENT ON BEHALF OF GOVERNMENT & COMMUNITY RELATIONS MANAGER, MELISSA SEIXAS -As part of an on-going review of our electric delivery system and to further improve efficiency, it is necessary for us to make changes in the dates we currently read customer meters in a given month. Beginning in late July, we will change the meter reading and billing schedule for approximately 650,000 meters in Pinellas and Pasco counties. The change will occur over four months and the entire project should be completed by mid-November 2014. The upcoming change to customer meter readings will impact the date some customers receive their bills and, subsequently, the due date. Some customers may receive a bill covering a slightly extended period which could result in a higher than normal bill. After this one-time schedule adjustment, billing statements will be issued approximately every 30 days as they are today. Customers will receive letters in advance of the project, but recognize you might receive questions from your constituents as well. Duke Energy offers a number of payment programs to assist customers with their monthly bills and we are committed to working with them through this billing change as well. -PINELLAS COUNTY ANIMAL SERVICES NEEDS FOSTER CARE FAMILIES - Pinellas County Animal Services is seeking volunteers to join the foster care team, as part of an effort to save pets that need time away from the shelter. The program requires a foster application and approval. All foster care parents are required to complete the volunteer orientation class and foster training held on Tuesday, Aug. 5, at the Pinellas County Animal Services shelter. Volunteer orientation begins at 10:30 a.m., and foster training immediately follows at 12:30 p.m. Some of the animals that will benefit from the program include puppies and kittens too young for adoption, those recovering from surgery or illness, senior pets that need to be out of a shelter environment, dogs that have been on the adoption list for an extended period, and adoptable pets requiring socialization skills that can only be learned in a home environment. Volunteers interested in becoming a foster parent will work directly with the adoption coordinator and medical staff. Foster care training will provide potential foster parents with basic animal cleaning and feeding tips, information on feline upper respiratory infection and the shelter's emergency procedures. To be part of the foster care team, participants must possess: Genuine concern for the welfare of the animals; Willingness to be compassionate to special needs animals; Commitment to follow all foster policies and directives as required by the adoption coordinator; A valid driver's license and vehicle to transport foster animals to and from shelter. In 2013, Pinellas County Animal Services fostered 1,096 animals that needed additional time and care.
